

# Covid cases drop by 13.4%

FPI BUREAU / NEW DELHI: India on Friday recorded a further drop in the daily Covid-19 infections to 58,077, which were 13.4% less than the previous day, while the cumulative infections reached 4,25,36,137, including 4,13,31,158 recoveries and 5,07,177 fatalities, including 675

in the last 24 hours. Kerala continued to top with 188 Covid-19 deaths, followed by Maharashtra with 45 deaths, Karnataka (39), Punjab (30), Gujarat (21) and Delhi (12). The daily positivity rate further fell to 4%. The active caseload dropped further to 6,97,802 cases while 74.78 crore people have so far undergone tests for the disease. The national vaccination registered 171.79 crore people getting the doses so far.

### Do not make hijab a...

The Bench, which also included Justices A S Bopanna and Ms Hima Kohli, had also refused urgent hearing, when pressed on Thursday by senior advocate Kapil Sibal; then, too, the apex court took the plea that the High Court was already seized of the matter. Kamat insisted that the Karnataka High Court's order -- that no one should wear religious dress or anything that is a manifestation of religious identity -- had far-reaching implications.

The High Court's interim decision to ban all religious dresses, including hijab and saffron shawls, till an order was passed in the matter, saw a student moving the Apex Court challenging the HC order.

The student had relied on certain oral remarks of the full bench of the High Court to seek an urgent hearing by the Supreme Court. He objected to the High Court's interim order, which had said: "We will direct that the institutions shall start. But till the matter is pending before the court, these students and all stakeholders, they shall not insist on wearing religious garments, may be headress or saffron shawl. We will restrain everyone." On Kamat's contention that Article 25 is in danger, the CJ said, "If there is anything wrong, we will protect, but think it over, is it proper to bring these things to Delhi, on a national level?"

### Mom, son kill bank AGM...

The mother and son revealed that they were fed up with Seshadri and his behaviour, as he was not contributing to family expenses and had a troubled relationship with them. Jaisheela and Arvind had a heated argument with Seshadri on Thursday, after which the duo is alleged to have plotted his murder. They reportedly set the alarm for 4am the following day, banged Seshadri's head against the wooden cot, cut his left wrist with a sharp weapon to portray it as a suicide attempt and an hour later, threw him out of the window after cutting the pigeon net.

While the duo had made a foolproof plan, they failed to clean the bloodstains in the bedroom. The mother-son duo knew that the neighbours on the seventh floor were not home and thought that Friday morning would be opportune to execute their plan. A senior officer said that Arvind was disappointed as he was seeking job prospects in New Zealand and had asked for his father's help. Seshadri had refused.

During the probe, Jaisheela said that she had a troubled marriage and was allegedly tormented by Seshadri, being asked to sleep in the living room, as he said the bedroom was only his own. The arrested duo has been booked under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code for murder (section 302), causing disappearance of evidence (section 201) and common intention (section 34). They will be produced before the local magistrate court on Saturday.

### Lesson for jr. education...

Standing Committee chairman Yashwant Jadhav directed Additional Commissioner P Velrasu to provide the details on the said proposal and kept it pending. despite this drop in the daily caseload, as the virus is still around in the community and people are continuing to contract the infection. "We need to follow Covid norms and masks will have to be worn for more than six to seven months, as there is community spread of the virus and we continue to get patients infected with Delta, Delta derivatives and Omicron variants. Importantly, people who are partially vaccinated should get vaccinated as soon as their dates are near," said a doctor from a civic-run hospital.

Despite the decline in cases, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) has maintained that it will be monitoring cases till February-end before deciding on entirely lifting restrictions in the city. "There are no plans to completely lift restrictions in the city yet. We will be monitoring case trends in the coming weeks before taking a call," Kakani said.

Officials said the increasing vaccine coverage was encouraging. The BMC is taking various steps to do so, including calling up citizens who may have missed their second dose, holding vaccine-on-wheels camps in areas with high footfall and encouraging housing societies to keep it informed in case someone has missed their dose.

### These 'biggies' are missing...

But, in 2006, he was suspended from the Samajwadi Party. Two years later, he joined the Congress. In 2009, Babbar won the by-election from Firozabad. But he lost both the 2014 and 2019 elections. On the other hand, Congress leaders from other states -- Chhattisgarh chief minister Bhupesh Baghel, Rajasthan Congress leader Sachin Pilot and former Maharashtra chief minister Prithviraj Chavan, to name a few -- have been active in the election circuit. As polling moves from west UP to east, another seasoned leader smarting under a 'snub' is Shiv Pal Yadav, brother of Mulayam Singh Yadav and once estranged uncle of Akhilesh Yadav, who recently buried the family hatchet and made up with Akhilesh.

Known to wield considerable clout in the Yadav-belt, Shiv Pal, who is contesting from Jaswant Nagar constituency, has so far not shared the dais with nephew Akhilesh in any of the party's road shows.

The only exception -- who has chosen to stay out voluntarily from the poll arena -- is BSP supreme Mayawati. The four-time Chief Minister of UP has been active only on Twitter. She sometimes issues a press note and her second in command in the party, Satish Mishra, has made it clear that neither he nor 'behenji' will contest the assembly polls. There are several others who were at the forefront of their party's campaign but have vanished with time. It includes the likes of Sri Prakash Jaiswal from the Congress, Ahmad Hasan from Samajwadi Party, Rita Bahuguna Joshi from BJP, etc.

### Sale of wine in marts...

The PIL reads: "The resolution casts a duty upon the

state to prohibit consumption of intoxicating drinks and drugs which are injurious to health and to improve the standard of living and improve the public health at large."

According to the earlier resolution, "there shall be no sale of alcohol near educational, government offices, parks, hospitals, religious places and state and national highways". It further stated, "the government is bound to close any establishment selling alcohol if 25 per cent of female voters in that area call for closure of it".

"Unfortunately, the said cabinet decision of the Maharashtra government is directly contrary to this resolve of the government itself and it speaks loudly about making available an elaborate market for wine products and effective marketing of wine in Maharashtra and to popularize wine drinking," the PIL adds. It added that the January 2022 decision only bars the sale of wine in stores near educational and religious institutions. The PIL prays that the HC declare the cabinet decision as "unconstitutional" and ultra vires the Maharashtra Prohibition Act and the 2011 government resolution.

It has also sought a stay on the operation and effect of the cabinet decision till the PIL is decided.

### A Dalit woman's body

killed her and buried her on the premises of the Divyanand Ashram, situated on the banks of river Ganga. Two months back the mother of the deceased had accused the son of kidnapping her daughter. However, the police, instead of taking any action, only registered a 'missing person' case. The distraught mother, Rita Singh, on January 24, tried to jump in front of the convoy of former Chief Minister Akhilesh Yadav to highlight her plight.

After this, the police swung into action and arrested the accused Rajoul Singh. During investigation, the accused admitted to having killed the girl, it is claimed. The autopsy report of the deceased has revealed that she was strangled. The post-mortem report also showed that her neck was broken. The police claim the case appeared to be one of an affair gone awry.

Facing political flak, SP chief Akhilesh Yadav told ANI: The person who they are saying belongs to the Samajwadi Party died four years ago. The police should answer why it took them so long to act in the matter. We are with the victim's family. We are with her mother and her demand should be met."

For the Yogi government, this is political fodder in election season. "Akhilesh Yadav, a Dalit daughter's body has been found from a Samajwadi Party leader's land. You didn't listen to the girl's mother when she was begging in front of your car. You are shielding your party leader. You will shield every crime of Samajwadi Party leaders. You will leave no stone unturned to help the accused," tweeted Deputy Chief Minister Keshav Prasad Maurya, the number two in the Yogi Adityanath-led BJP government.

### SC raps Yogi govt for...

The UP government has acted like a "complainant, adjudicator and prosecutor" in conducting the proceedings to attach the properties of the accused, said a bench of justices DY Chandrachud and Surya Kant. "Withdraw the proceedings or we will quash it for being in violation of the law laid down by this court," the bench said. The top court was hearing a plea seeking quashing of notices sent to alleged protesters by the district administration for recovering losses caused because of damage to public properties during the anti-CAA agitation in UP and asked the state to respond to it.

# Delay in intimating insurer of auto theft: Cannot deny claim

**NEW DELHI:** Mere delay in intimating an insurance company about theft of an insured vehicle cannot be a ground to deny the claim if an FIR about the incident has been lodged, the Supreme Court said on Friday.

The significant verdict came on an appeal of a company whose insured truck was robbed on Nov 4, 2007 and police, acting on the FIR, lodged next day, arrested the accused but could not recover the insured vehicle.

Oriental Insurance Company Ltd repudiated the claim on the ground it was informed about the loss of vehicle belatedly and won the case at the National Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission (NCDRC). The NCDRC, in 2016, had set aside the findings of the District Consumer Forum and the Haryana State Consumer Disputes Commission holding the insurance firm rightly repudiated the claim on the ground of delayed intimation. A bench comprising Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Bela M Trivedi set aside the NCDRC judgement and held the mere delay in intimating the insurer was not fatal to the claim.

### NBWs against 8 HM ultras

**NEW DELHI:** A Delhi court has issued arrest warrants against 8 alleged Hizb-ul-Mujahideen terrorists on charges of money laundering related to funding terrorist and secessionist activities in J&K. Additional Sessions Judge Parveen Singh issued non-bailable warrants (NBWs) against Gulam Nabi Khan, Umer Farooq Shera, Manzoor Ahmad Dar, Zaffar Hussain Bhat, Nazir Ahmad Dar, Abdul Majeed Sofi, Mubarak Shah and Mohd Yusuf on a plea moved by the Enforcement Directorate (ED). The court noted the submission made by ED's special public prosecutor Nitesh Rana that the accused persons had been declared proclaimed offenders in 2013 itself.

### Irregularity by bank staff?

**NEW DELHI:** Bank employees hold the position of trust where honesty and integrity are essential conditions and any irregularity on their part should not be dealt with leniently, the Supreme Court said on Friday. A bench of justices Ajay Rastogi and Abhay S Oka made the observation, upholding an order of dismissal against a bank clerk for serious irregularities in discharge of his duties.

### Anna Univ probe report to ex-VC

**CHENNAI:** The Madras High Court on Friday ordered the Tamil Nadu government to furnish a copy of the inquiry report of justice Kalayirasan to former vice-chancellor of Anna University, MK Surappa so that his explanation could be part of the inquiry proceedings. The report is to be forwarded to the governor of Tamil Nadu, who is the chancellor of the University. Justice V Parthiban of the Madras HC passed the orders on the basis of a petition filed by the former Vice-Chancellor.

### Zakir Naik to be in court

**NEW DELHI:** After Islamic evangelist and preacher Zakir Naik showed an inability to go

to the Indian Embassy in Malaysia for authentication of his credentials for vakalatnama, the UAPA Tribunal said, "He is bound to file a vakalatnama in proper format with proper authentication or he may remain physically present on the next date of hearing". The Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act Tribunal noted, "Despite the order passed by this Tribunal on the last date of hearing, vakalatnama in proper format, with proper authentication of Dr. Zakir Abdul Karim Naik has not been filed."

### Common syllabus plea junked

**NEW DELHI:** The Supreme Court on Friday refused to entertain a PIL against certain sections of the Right to Education Act-2009 for being "arbitrary and irrational" and seeking introduction of a common syllabus and curriculum for children across the country. A bench of Justices L Nageswara Rao and BR Gavai asked the petitioner advocate Ashwini Upadhyay to approach the high court in this regard. The matter was dismissed as withdrawn.

### Salgaocar Marine status quo

**NEW DELHI:** In an ex-parte order, the Supreme Court ordered a status quo, confined to the appeals by Salgaocar Marine Pvt Ltd on a judgment of the western zone of the National Green Tribunal on August 31, 2020. A Bench of Justices S Abdul Nazeer and Aniruddha Bose allowed the appeal and issued notice to the Goa govt. It also tagged it with a civil appeal No 121 of 2021. —Our Bureau

### Kalra can travel abroad

**NEW DELHI:** The Delhi HC allowed businessman Navneet Kalra, an accused in the case of alleged black marketing of oxygen concentrators during the second wave of the COVID-19, to travel abroad on two occasions to attend certain eyewear industry events subject to a security deposit of Rs50 lakh.

## SC Employees Assn. moves top court as govt rejects CJJ's recommendation for court allowance

**NEW DELHI:** The Supreme Court on Friday issued notice on a plea by the SC Employees Welfare Association against a decision of the central govt rejecting a recommendation made by the CJJ granting "court allowance" to employees of the apex court [SC Employees Welfare Association v. Union of India]. A Bench of Justices DY Chandrachud and Surya Kant sought response from the Centre to the plea which stated that the letter of the Ministry of Law and Justice dated September 25, 2020 conveying its decision to reject the CJJ's recommendation, was violative of Articles 14 and 146 of the Constitution, bar and Bench reported.

## Head of SC panel on Char Dham all-weather road quits

**DEHRADUN:** The chairman of the Supreme Court-appointed high-powered committee on Char Dham all-weather road, Ravi Chopra, has resigned expressing disappointment over the SC order limiting the panel's jurisdiction to only two 'non-defence' stretches of the project. Tendering his resignation to the SC secretary-general, Chopra said the HPC's directions and recommendations have either been ignored or tardily responded to by the ministry of road transport and highways. In an order on Dec 14, 2021, the SC had given the task of overseeing 70% of the 900-km all-weather road project to an 'oversight committee', headed by a retired judge and confined the HPC's role to oversee the implementation of only 2 'non-defence' stretches of the project.
